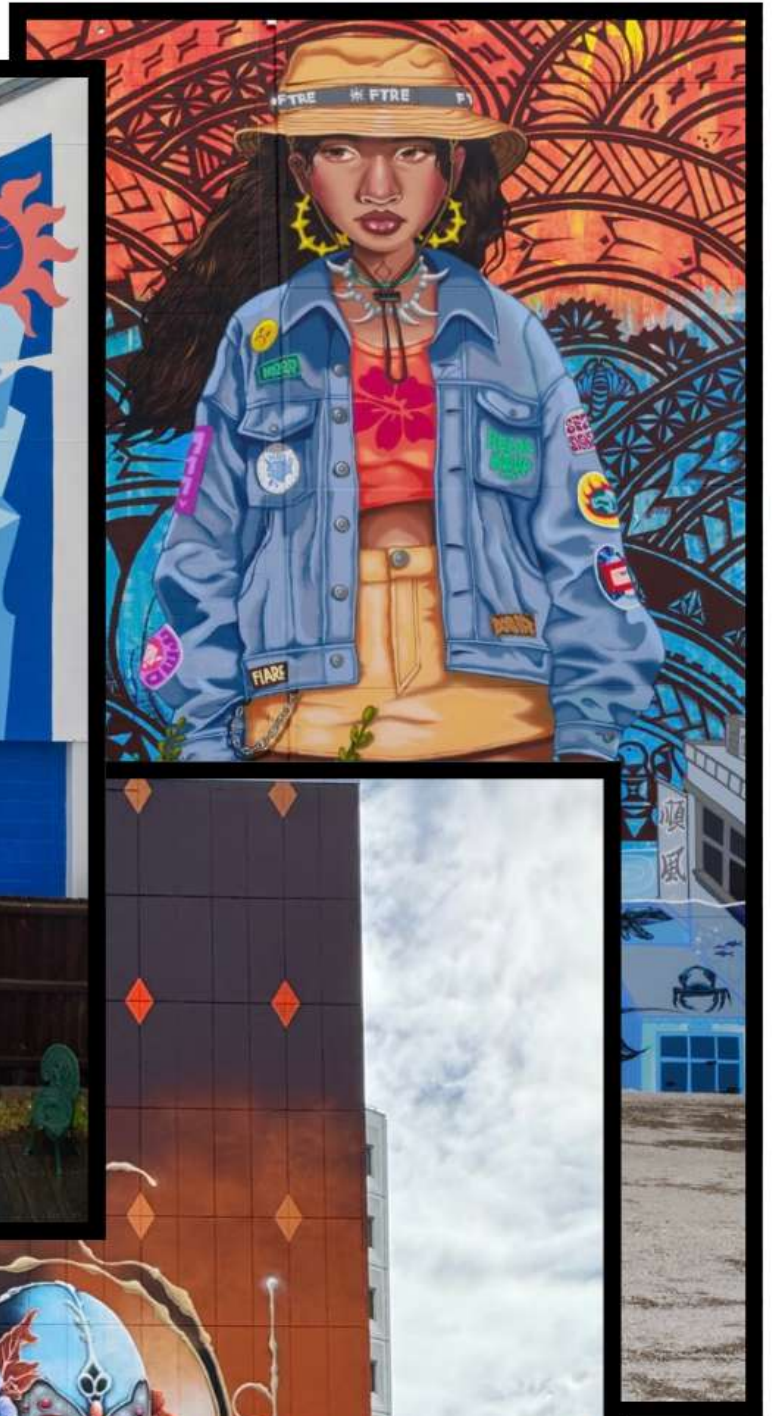




A large collaborative mural by Kophie Loaf and Monti Masiu, painted for an environmental campaign in Christchurch CBD.

Rich in deep blues, warm oranges and earthy tones, the work features a central female figure in contemporary clothing, surrounded by cultural and natural symbolism. Created for the FLARE Ōtautahi Street Art Festival.

A large-scale mural by Christchurch artist Jacob Yikes, completed during the FLARE Ōtautahi Street Art Festival in March 2025. The work stretches 53 metres making it the tallest mural in New Zealand. Warm and dark tones dominate the composition. At the centre of the scene stands a female figure adorned with flowers and intricate symbolic detail.

A large mural by artist Kell Sunshine, created during the FLARE Ōtautahi Street Art Festival. The work spans an entire building facade and features bold blues and warm orange tones. The composition moves vertically through different layers, with symbolic shapes and creatures arranged throughout. The mural focuses on the natural world and its hidden systems.
